Gardening Tidbits

As most of my gardening chores are coming to a close for this year, one significant event has yet to take place. Planting my garlic! The bed is ready, the soil enriched and limed, my largest and healthiest bulbs put aside, the mulch collected ... now I'm waiting for the right planting time. This year it will be on the November full moon. Planting on a full moon is favourable for transplanting plants and for planting root crops, perennials, biennials, and bulbs. As the moon wanes, the energy is drawing down into the Earth and encouraging good root growth. The gravitational pull is high, creating more moisture in the soil. The moonlight is decreasing, putting energy into the roots.

Linda Gilkeson says that planting garlic when the soil has become cooler and wetter discourages the risk of infection from Blue Mold Rot - a devastating fungus. Using properly dried and cured garlic bulbs is essential to minimizing the risk of the fungus, as is taking care when separating the cloves (just before planting) to minimize injury to the cloves.

For many people garlic is a wonderful and delicious addition to food dishes. However, throughout ancient history in many civilizations, the main use of garlic was

for its health and medicinal properties. One of the earliest documented plants used by people for the treatment of diseases and maintenance of health was garlic. We now know that when garlic is chopped, crushed or chewed it releases allicin (also responsible for garlic's distinct smell). Allicin then turns into fat and water soluble compounds containing sulphur that travel all over the body, exerting potent biological effects. Garlic is a highly nutritious, immune boosting, powerful antioxidant - and given the right conditions, very easy to grow. As Hippocrates said, "Let food be thy medicine, and medicine be thy food". Happy Gardening!

Resilience: Building Community in the Age of Climate Disruption

The other day I walked along Graham Lake and was sad to see big old cedar trees with half their branches covered in red, dead needles. Even though their roots are close to water, they are obviously suffering from a long summer without enough rain. Just now there are wildfires burning on the Canadian Prairies and still some in California. The impacts of climate change were clear when a friend drove over the Rockies this summer and the glacier he saw three summers ago was gone.

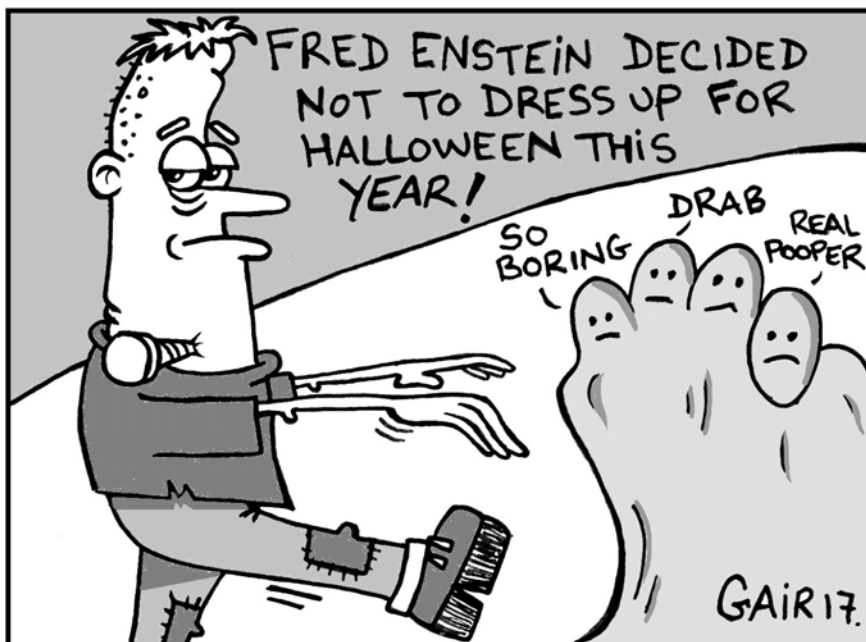

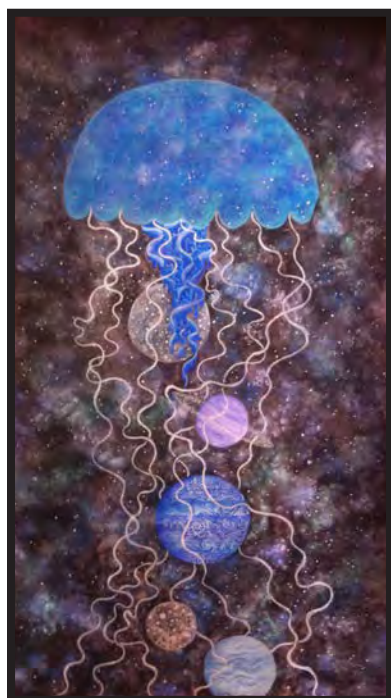

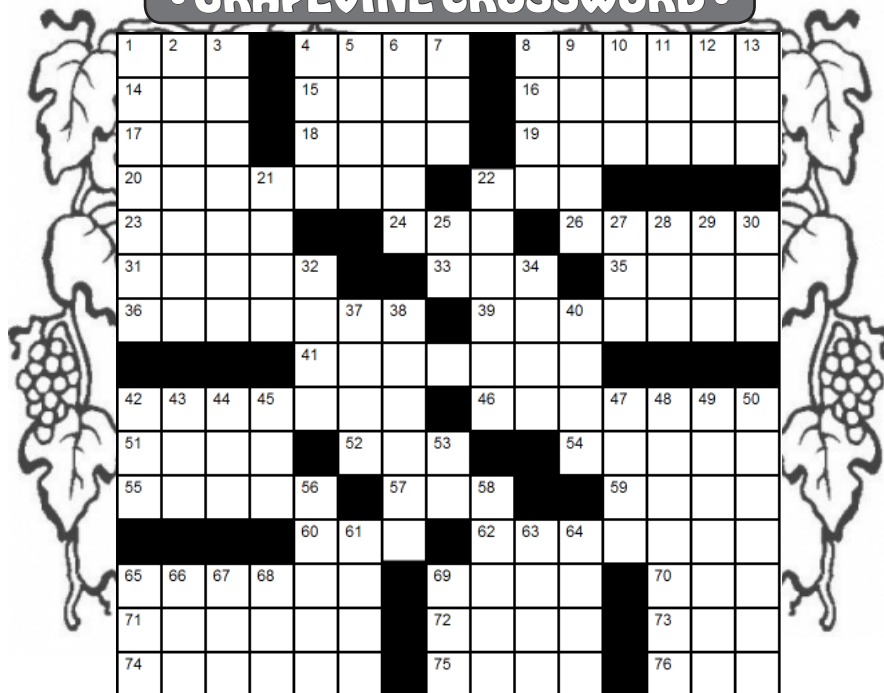
And speaking of digging, we are pleased to announce that Teresa Beers is willing to continue providing for the community her 'Gardening Tidbits' articles in 'The Grape.'
