Looking to the Night's Sky: Astronomical Events in November

Living in a rural area gives star-gazers the benefit of not having to deal with that dreaded of all foes - *light pollution*. Without the innumerable sources of illumination that are found in cities to wash out the faint light of stars, the rural astronomical observer is able to witness far more amazing astronomical events in the night sky.

Throughout history humans have been observing and noting the myriad of wondrous

spectacles that occurred in the skies above them. Over the millennia, a pattern was discovered of predictable astronomical phenomena - from the ever-returning comets to showers of meteors to the always awe inspiring solar eclipses.

Each month there is a chance to view something new in the darkened skies - and with November now here and December being just around the corner - I thought I'd share with you what is in store for astronomical entertainment and inspiration.

The November 4th full Moon

was once considered by some Aboriginal Peoples as the sign for the last chance to set beaver traps before the coming Winter freeze. It has been called the Full Beaver Moon, Frosty Moon and Hunter's Moon.

On November 10th the Taurid Meteor Showers will be at their peak. The Taurids, like most meteor showers, are the result of the Earth passing through the dust trail of an asteroid or comet. The debris from the trail burn up in a streak of light as they fly through the Earth's atmosphere. The Taurids are unusual because they are produced by 2 different passing bodies: Asteroid 2004 TG10 and Comet 2P Encke. To view the light show, head outside just after midnight and look for the Taurus constellation located just above and to the right of Orion.

Just before sunrise on November 13th a conjunction of 2 planets can be viewed.

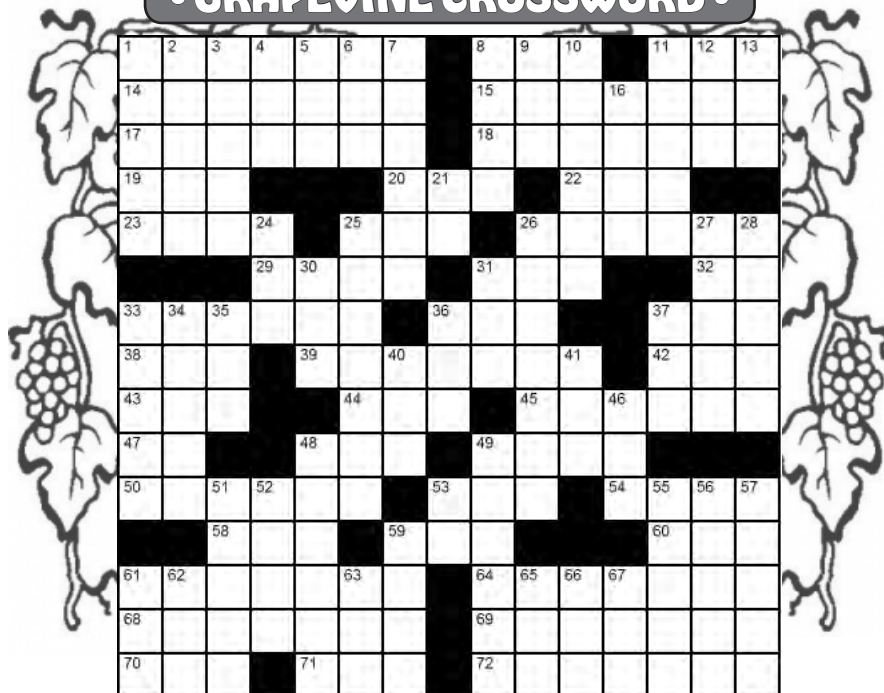

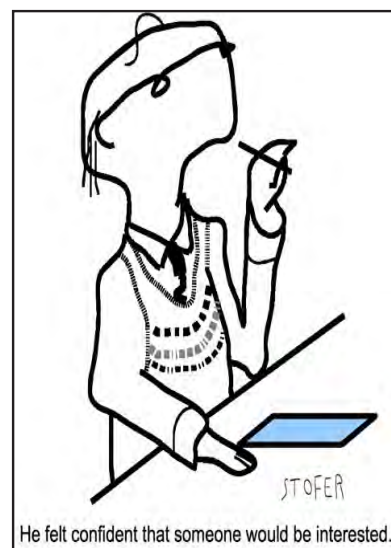
