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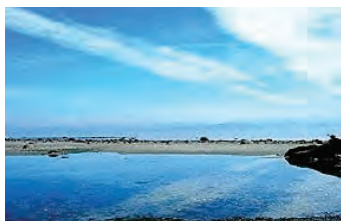

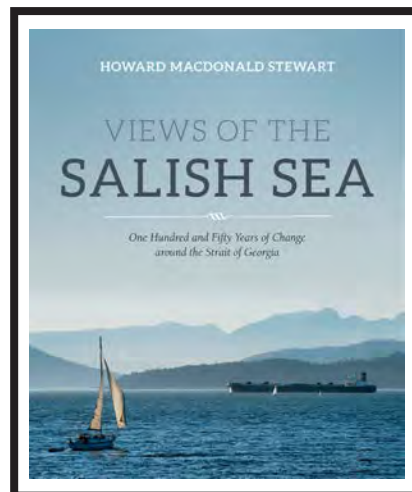
Book Review: Views of the Salish Sea *One hundred and fifty years of change around the Gulf of Georgia*

The French aphorist Jean de La Bruyere (1645-1696) once remarked that "Men invent the fortune of a pretty face". The beautiful Salish Sea is no exception. The Salish Sea has long enjoyed a reputation for enormous natural wealth, even when that wealth has been so badly managed that contemporary society is a pauper compared to the abundance of 150 years ago. Yet Harold Stewart's highly readable and engaging history is anything but nostalgic or crusading. This important book is a hard and much needed look at the complex reality of what management of the Salish Sea has come to mean.

It is a complicated story that traces the history of human impact on the North Salish Sea (the book does not include the South Salish Sea of Puget Sound) told through the development of five different dimensions: resource extraction (mining and logging), fishing, waste dumping, recreation, and the marginalization of the indigenous peoples. The book spans the 150 years between the arrival of the Hudson's Bay Company up to about 1980, with less specific references to subsequent decades.

"Looking at it from afar," Stewart says, "a lot of groups . . . get you really worried because they think that the Strait will be dead in ten years. That's been going on for a long time. Jacques Cousteau said the same thing in the 1970s, that the Strait would be dead in ten or twenty years if we didn't do something." Stewart wanted to test the resilience of that assumption. He mentions trends in recent ecological history, such as *Bison and People on the North American Great Plains: A Deep Environmental History* that sees the decline of the bison as a gradual process involving not just railways and indiscriminate slaughter, but many different factors over time as well.

Stewart also wanted to contribute to the management dialogue about the North Salish Sea. An international environmental consultant who has worked for CIDA (Canadian

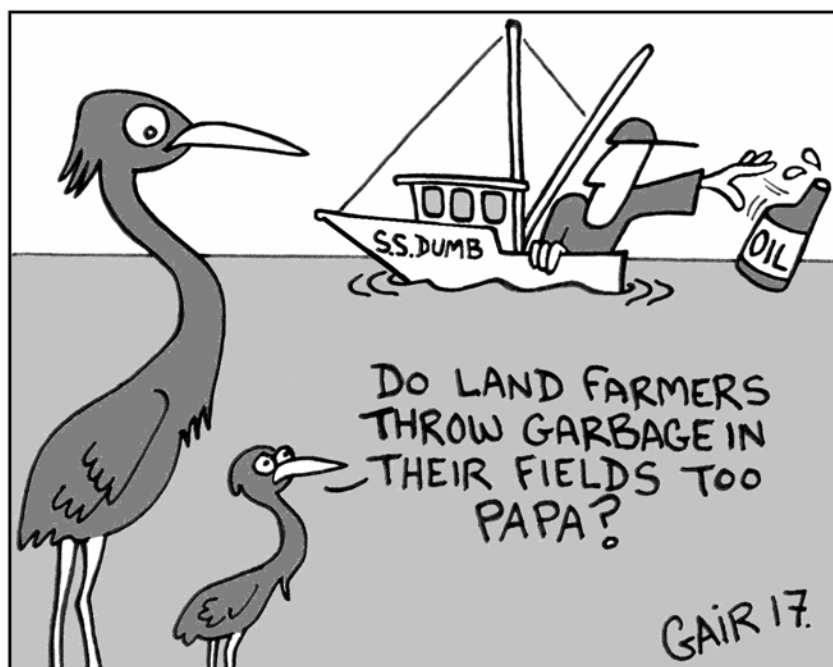
International Development Agency) and the World Bank amongst others, he has come to believe that environmental groups everywhere tend to suffer from a common flaw: "They don't get where other people are coming from."

In reviewing the different dimensions, it is clear that all had their own imperatives and requirements, produced benefits and caused losses, had unforeseen consequences (especially technological development), and that the overall picture is affected by events far beyond anyone's control (British Colonial policy and two world wars, for a start). All of these factors are acting on management of the Salish Sea today. Perhaps nowhere is this better exemplified than in the excellent chapter *Resource Mining in the Sea: Fish and Oysters*, of special interest to all of Baynes Sound.

There is a dawning realization that the answer to management of such an intensely exploited and treasured resource probably lies in management as an ecology, particularly with that tough new sheriff in town, Climate Change, whose impact threatens to override the interests of any stakeholder. Stewart is not sure if and how that might come about partly because of the sheer complexity of the task, a complexity that like fractals only multiply at smaller scales as analysis endeavours to take into account the environment and human usage in each area and geographical feature of the North Salish. For this reason, Stewart points out, academic research would prefer a far narrower time frame, or focus on a much smaller area.

Stewart sees the price of this complexity in the lack of a

single voice that can be heard over the clamour of special interests. Between that and the hyperfocus of stakeholders on their own viewpoint, the message can't be heard for the information.

Under present circumstances the situation is unlikely to improve for another reason: the growing dearth of information. *Views of the Salish Sea* started as a late career UBC doctoral thesis. It ends in the 1980s because after that, the archival records of government grow ominously sparse and increasingly disingenuous. By contrast, Stewart says, earlier government administrators, especially in the nineteenth century, were disarmingly frank and open in their reports and correspondence, ironically laying the foundation for the airtight legal cases of today that have transformed the status of indigenous rights.

Stewart sees neoliberalism – the move to limit the role of government as much as possible that began to take hold in the 1980's – as a major contributor to the archival drought. Governments began to reduce monitoring and reduce staff. "Governments," he says, "simply do not want you to know what is going on," and cites his experience at CIDA, which is very selective about what ends up in the National Archives. In

BC, the Provincial Archives is now part of the Royal British Columbia Museum and is no longer a department of government, making accession permanent government records for public access an option instead of a mandatory requirement.

Added to all this, the switch to electronic records has not helped. Digital records are not well controlled or stored; e-mail is all too easy to wipe out. In contrast to paper, nobody can guarantee their continued accessibility in the face of technological change over time.

For all that, *Views of the Salish Sea* is a must-read for anyone concerned about the future of not just Denman and Hornby, but also Vancouver or Victoria. For these large populations insulated from direct dependence, the North Salish Sea has become for many mainly a beautiful view about whose fortune they should think very carefully.

Your feedback will help us identify opportunities to improve the safety at the terminals and provide a cost-effective, customer-focused travel experience. We will be hosting two drop-in sessions:

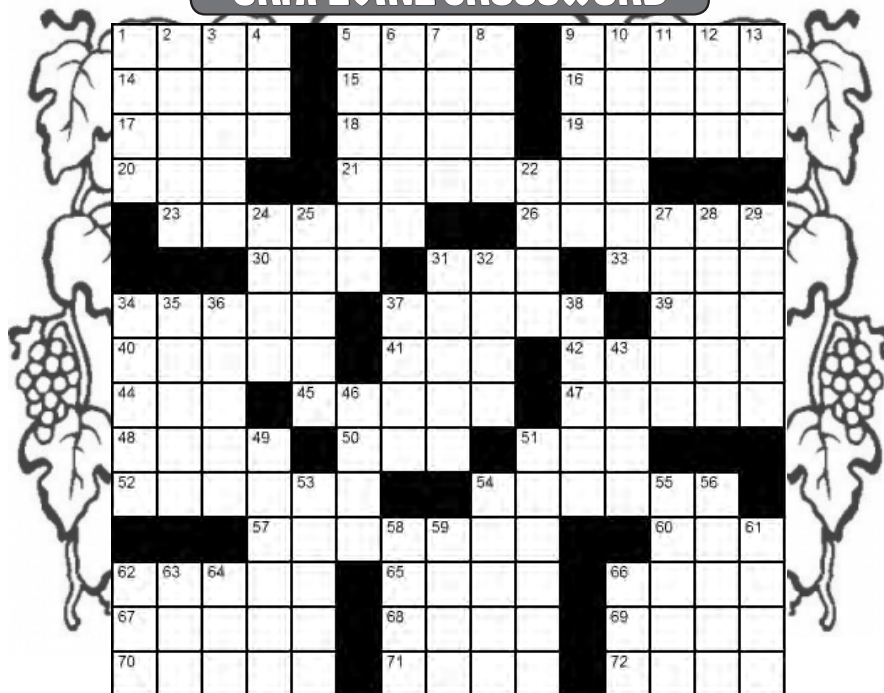

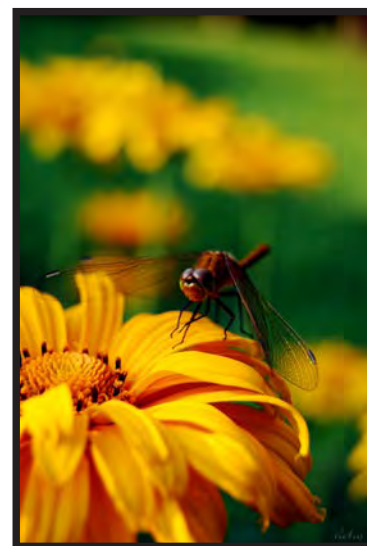
