**Denman West Assured Loading Update**

The Ferry Advisory Committee wants to present both islands with an update on the assured loading pilot for Hornby traffic catching the 8 a.m. sailing from Denman West.

The project allows the first 15 cars catching the 7:30 ferry from Shingle Spit to be assured they will be get on at 8 o'clock at Denman West. (This provides certainty for some Hornby travelers who have appointments, travel connections, employment/educational commitments etc. that they will arrive on time.) These cars have been identified at Shingle Spit and given a card to present when loading at Denman West. When approaching the terminal they have their four way flashers on and wait at the bottom of the ferry hill until directed to load.

The loading process may look confusing but it works very well for the ferry staff. They begin by taking the first two rows of Denman traffic waiting in the terminal. Next they load the 15 assured Hornby cars as they turn over their cards. Then the remaining Denman traffic in rows 3 and beyond are loaded followed by Hornby cars over and above the 15 with assured loading. Late arriving Denman cars will also get on if there is still room.

As you are aware, this is a busy ferry with students going to schools and has a short turnaround. Loading has to be done quickly and ferry employees need our cooperation to make it work. The FAC is very disappointed to hear reports of people giving the finger to workers and even driving in a dangerous manner towards an employee. This pilot program is the result of extensive consultation to identify and balance everyone's needs. It is designed to give a reasonable degree of access to an important sailing for the residents of both islands. We anticipated residents would accept this program in a spirit of co-operation and take directions from ferry staff in an appropriate manner.

Here are a few things to consider and watch for if you are taking the 8 a.m. ferry. During the course of the past year only 29 sailings were overloaded, approximately 10% for the year. Therefore 90% of the time all the traffic will get on. Many of these overloads occurred after a long weekend and generally in the shoulder or summer season. So for Hornby islanders might want to consider trying to make appointments for a day further in the week following a long weekend. Denman islanders might want to consider taking

“Pleasure”, Prince Tall-eyrand once remarked (thinking, no doubt, of the pleasures of his famous table), “knows no bounds”. But it does have an end, and one of those ends is time. In the case of art, all artists must ask, “What happens after I am gone?” This is one of the many good reasons to talk with Jane Fawkes, who has created an archive of her numerous and varied works in a career going back over 50 years.

Jane is a highly trained artist, beginning her art career with a three year Diploma in Textile Arts (1975) from the Northwest Handcraft House, and subsequently going on to earn first a diploma and then a BA in Fine Arts from Emily Carr College (1991), all in Vancouver. When she started out in the 70s, weaving was just getting big in California as architects began commissioning large-scale textile works for the walls of concrete office buildings, and she executed several large commissions. At first she had to ask to show her work, but by the end of the decade, major BC galleries, including Surrey and Richmond art galleries, were asking for exhibitions. Her children having reached school age, she was able to devote herself to a serious career as an artist.

The range of her work shows

Jane to be a technically inventive artist of many ideas. Perhaps nowhere is this more evident than in her installations which call on all her skills as a painter, draughtsman, textile artist, print maker and photographer - and in one, witty work, what one might call a furniture gardener with plants flourishing in an upholstered couch, and everything in the room painted green with a tablecloth of men’s underwear. Yet she is not, she says of herself, a “process person”, who derives pleasure primarily from the making (though ideas, she adds, must be “made”). Partly for this reason, she started to tire of the laborious process of weaving. Despite her creativity in working with textiles, such as combining

painting and photography with quilting, she yearned for more.

The rigid expectations of the professional artist began to weigh on her. “In the gallery world,” she says, “you must focus on the thing that makes you unique”, a tendency, she points out, that can be carried to extremes, citing a well-known French artist whose entire career is built around paintings done with an industrial sponge. Women, Jane thinks, are simply more versatile than men. “If the man was out hunting, he had to focus only on that deer, but the woman would be at home, taking care of children, cooking and weaving.” A course with iconic

Canadian artist Joyce Wieland, whom she came to know quite well, was seminal. Wieland encouraged her to break out of the art market strait jacket and pursue her own interests telling her that the work would circle back on itself over time to her identity as an artist. The concept of the circle, because it is the antithesis of hierarchy, and hence, of patriarchy, is fundamental to an understanding of her work.

The move to Denman in 1997 was the answer to what she was looking for: community. Both she and her husband Patrick had become serious environmental activists and it was her arrest at the 1993 Clayquot Sound logging protests that lead someone to suggest they might like to live on Denman. They saw an old farm with an apple orchard and were smitten. At first they thought that it was too much land, too much work. But she would return to Comox where they had moved after 30 years in Vancouver, and wake up each morning "like a lover, thinking of the place and what I could do." Though he found nothing in the house that was straight, Patrick, an engineer, eventually concluded that they could fix everything.

Since then, Jane's art has integrated itself more broadly into her life; she is no longer the career-focused artist working alone in her own guarded world. Her art is an intuitive, sometimes visceral, imaginative, and often, technically ingenious response to whatever interests her, especially eco-feminism, meditation, travel (especially to Burma, where they have been several times for retreats), and, lately, the cave paintings of Lascaux. She is not one for statements and explanations. You have to look to see, and take away what you will, informed by the interplay of textures, material techniques and content, sometimes referenced from other sources (such as Indian miniatures).

On Denman, Jane has had an exhibition once every two years. There is a lot of work, which she has carefully documented over the years. This documentation was used to create a website that is a catalogue of virtual-

ly all her work integrated with information on her life and development as an artist. Working with Miho Hajdrych, the website was a major undertaking, partly because of the volume of work, but also because a lot of the images had to be converted to digital from slides. Being able to access her work in its entirety has proven tremendously satisfying. Seeing it, Jane says, gives her oeuvre new meaning. She can see interrelationships in the totality, and no doubt astonish herself with the arc of her own

creative powers.

The archive site was not specifically created with posterity in mind, but it begs the question. Artists, by and large, are poorly served by the archival community. Museums do not always accept the unsold

works and records of artists unless they have an institutional relationship through a history of exhibitions or field of interest. There is also the issue of storing the physical works and the treatment of papers, since museums do not always see themselves as archives, and vice versa. The works and records of the famous will likely be in collections and be well documented. But the work of lesser known artists may be cut adrift by their death, ending up in the basements of relatives, damaged by neglect, or simply destroyed.

In the digital age, at least the

## What does the Pig War of 1859 have to do with Denman Island?

Over 160 years ago, the San Juan Islands were the subject of dispute between Great Britain and the United States. The British claimed the international border should be in Rosario Strait, while the Americans wanted Haro Strait to be the barrier. This was several years before the Dominion of Canada was created in 1867.

How did the pig come into the picture? And what is the connection to Denman Island?


Both British and American settlers were living on San Juan Island in those days, more or less peaceably, though politicians on both sides were scheming to claim exclusive hold of the territory. One day a pig owned by an Irishman, Charles Griffin

found its way into the potato patch of an American farmer, Lyman Cutlar. He promptly killed the pig. Griffin wanted compensation. Ten dollars was offered but he wanted \$100. Umbrage was taken by authorities on both sides. American troops were dispatched to the island.

In retaliation, the Governor of the Colony of Vancouver Island, James Douglas ordered the Commander of the Pacific Squadron to land marines on San Juan and engage the American soldiers.

And who was this Commander? None other than Rear Admiral Robert L. Baynes. An-

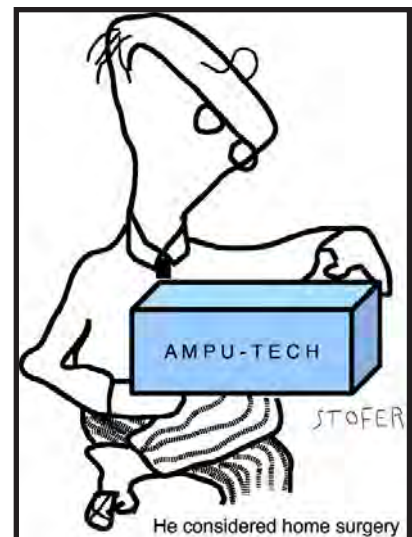

yone guessing the Denman connection yet?

And what did this esteemed British military man do? He refused to engage the enemy.



He told Governor Douglas that it would be foolish to provoke “two great nations in a war over a squabble about a pig.” It seems that soldiers on both sides agreed, and despite shouting insults, and goading each other to fire the fire shot, discipline held

and no military action ensued.

Many years later, in 1872, the dispute over the international boundary was referred to King Wilhelm I of Germany, and the result was the arbitration commission decided in favour of the American proposal. The San Juan Islands became the possessions of the United States, and provided another reason for the fledgling Canadian Government to be upset with Britain for not looking after Canadian territorial interests.

The lovely stretch of water between Denman and Vancouver Island was named after the redoubtable Rear Admiral Baynes, the sailor who refused to fight. 🍷

It is true that digital media are only in their infancy compared to paper, and are subject to the volatility of technological change, but they do offer interconnectivity, the replication of memory, and unmatched access. It’s a question of trusting the river. Denman’s artists are integral to the community, and Jane Fawkes website is an important example of how those many voices might continue to resonate over time.

So, I said, "you want a photograph incriminating him?"

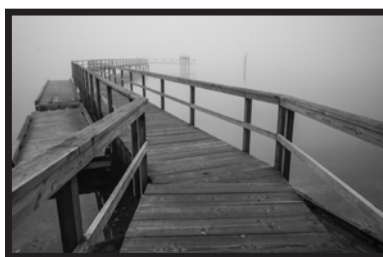
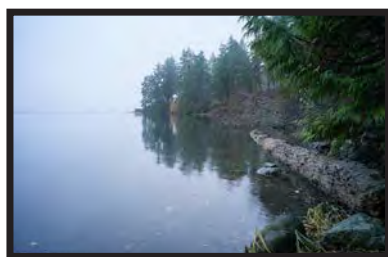

I followed him 24/7 through a thousand do-nut joints.

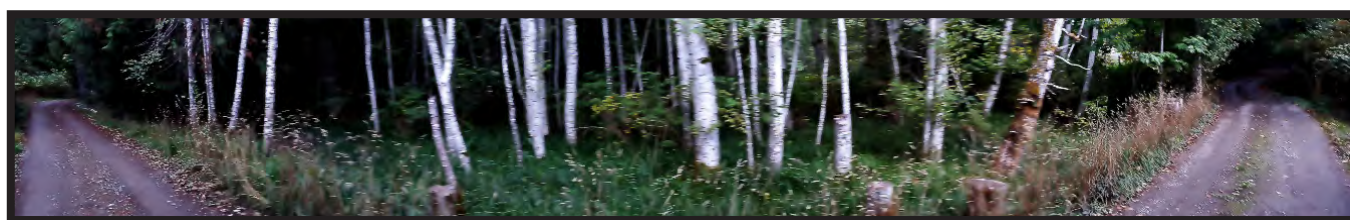

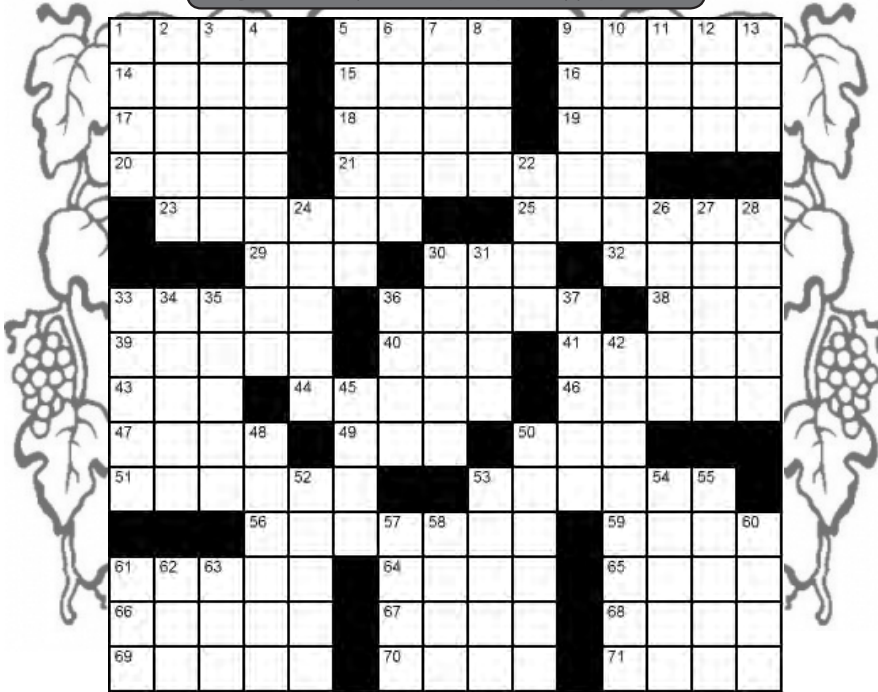

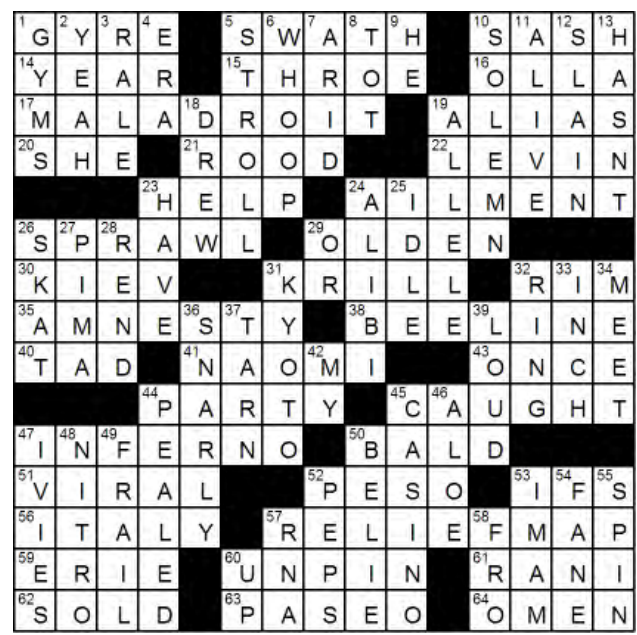
