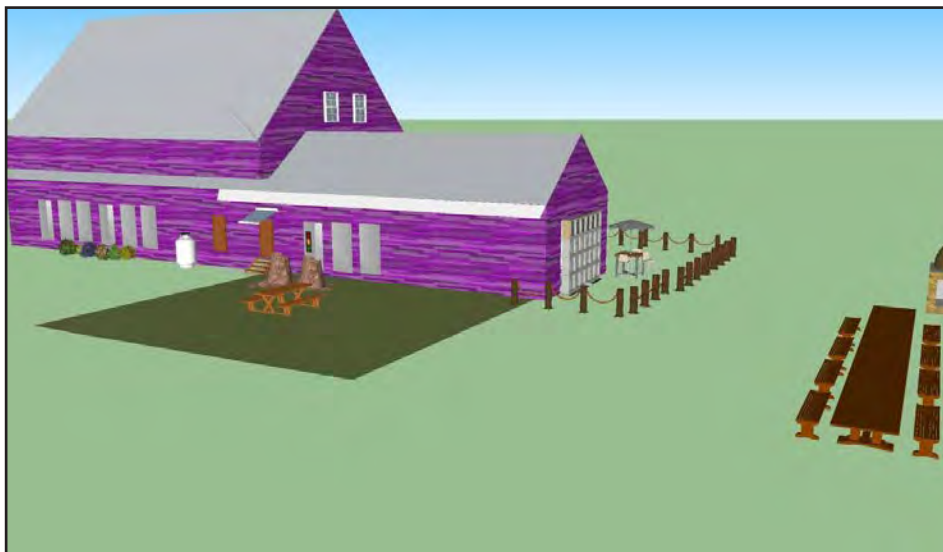
THE EARTH CLUB FACTORY

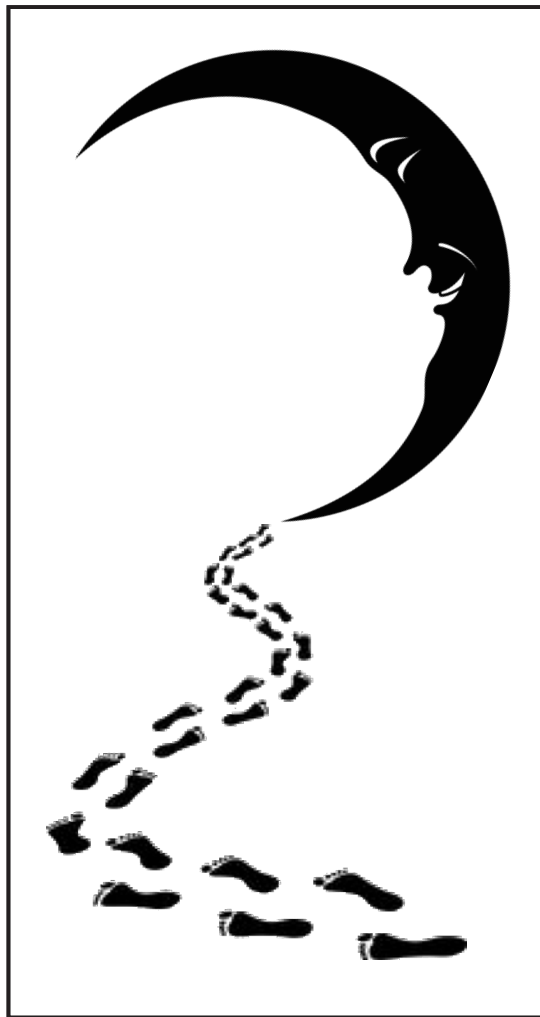
ACTIVITY CHALLENGE 2018

Welcome to our 2018 Challenge as we continue to Shoot For The Moon. If you are a newcomer to Denman (and there seems to be many of you) you may ask what is Shoot For The Moon all about. This is about keeping track of our steps as a community and together trying to reach the Moon. We are asking as many residents of Denman as possible to keep track (roughly) of the number of steps or Kilometres covered each day and adding them on to our tracking sheet to help us reach the Moon this year. Many of us have been tracking our kilometres for the last year and we to date have covered over 110,000 Kms towards reaching the moon. In case you didn't know, it is a total of 384,000 kms to get there. So we are almost a third of the way there. We have still many people who have yet to enter their distances. Last year we had just under 100 people contributing. Distances can be from walking or cycling. If you are a swimmer you can also contribute those distances. In fact you can count any way you move as long as it is powered by you and not a motor. The only requirement to join is to have a Denman address.

Distances can be determined by using a pedometer (we have a few at the clinic for free), by using an App on your smart phone if you have

one (such as Health which comes with most phones in the last couple of years, or Moves, or by wear-



ing a tracking device such as a fit-bit, garmin, jawbone, or misfits). Distances don't need to be overly accurate, an estimate will do. Then simply keep track and enter them on our Tracking sheet once a week or month. If you need a reminder, send me you email address and I will send you a reminder once a week or month (whichever you like).

The Activity Challenge is on the revamped website of the Activity Centre denmanactivitycentre.com

Find Activity Challenge 2018 and read the Welcome and then go to the tracking sheet, add your name on the next available sheet (or a pseudonym if you like) and start adding your kms. The 2017 sheet will also be available for those participating last year to add distances to last years total. The school kids are helping us by adding their daily activity. This year we are asking those using the Fitness centre to record their activities as well (see the sign up sheet in the downstairs gym).

I am confident that if we get enough people participating and entering their data that we will reach the moon this year. Why you might ask why are we doing this? Simply because being active is good for our physical and mental well being and by joining this challenge it will be a stimulus to do a little extra most days. The Canadian Physical Activity guidelines recommend that adults be moderately to vigorously active for 150 min. per week. Any activity that makes you sweat a little and be a bit out of breath but still able to carry on a conversation is defined as moderate, and being breathless and not able to carry on a conversation is

vigorous activity. This works out to about 20 min. per day and this can be done in 10 minute bits of activity. Also, just by being active through gardening, chopping wood, or getting your heart rate up through any other way can count towards getting the health benefits from being active. Benefits include reducing your risk of heart and stroke disease, diabetes and even some cancers. It is also important for reducing stress and improving mental health.

Strengthening activities are important especially for seniors and we hope to be offering some classes in the near future.

We will be having an Activity Event each month to help us along the way. Our first event will be on Tuesday, Jan. 16th at 11 a.m. We will be meeting at the entrance to Central Park and doing about a 5.5 km loop through the Park, out to Pickles Road and back along the cross Is-

land trail. However, you can also do a shorter loop if you like. Advance notice of our Feb. event is a snowshoe up at Mt. Washington on Tues. Feb 13.

So come and join us and help us reach our goal. If you have trouble accessing the web site or would prefer me to enter your distances then you can email me at rawilson33@gmail.com or drop them off at the medical clinic. 🍷

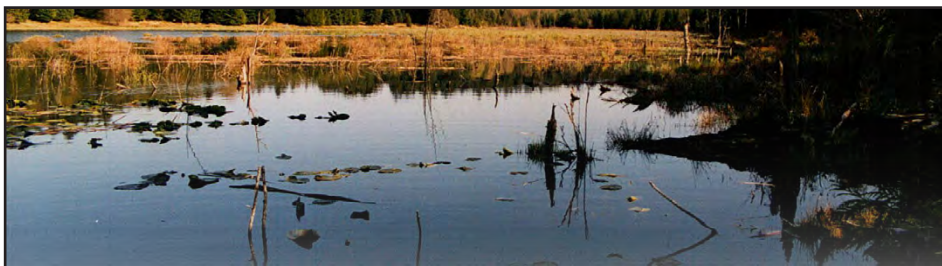
Beverages (both alcoholic and non alcoholic) and light snacks will be

DAYTIME 12-STEP STUDY GROUP ON DENMAN

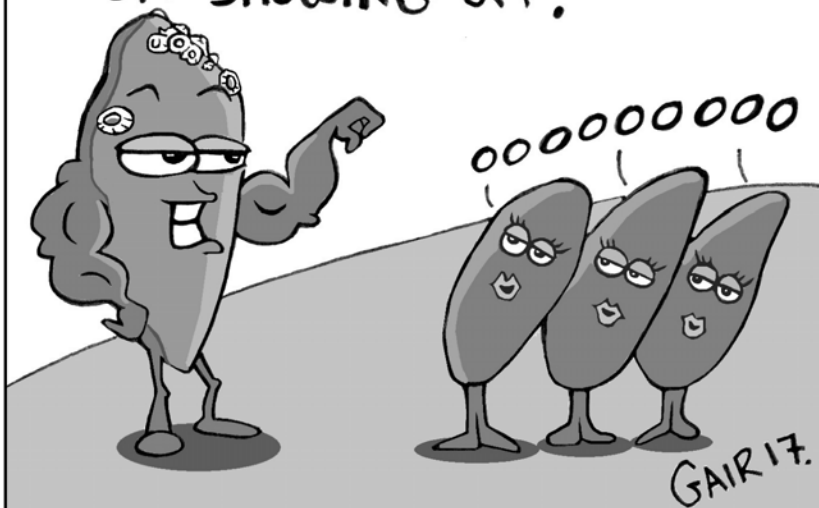

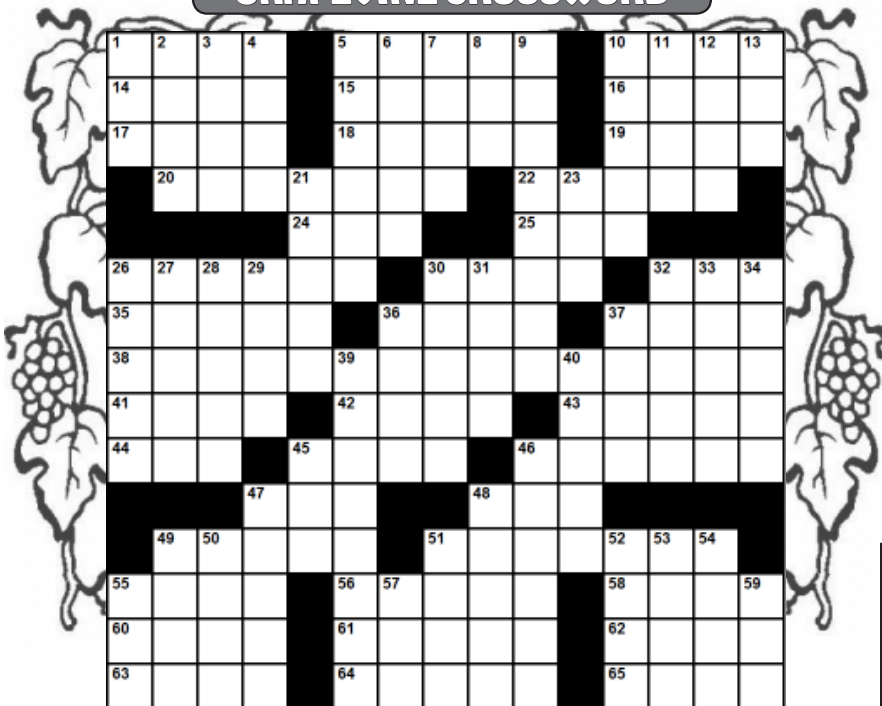

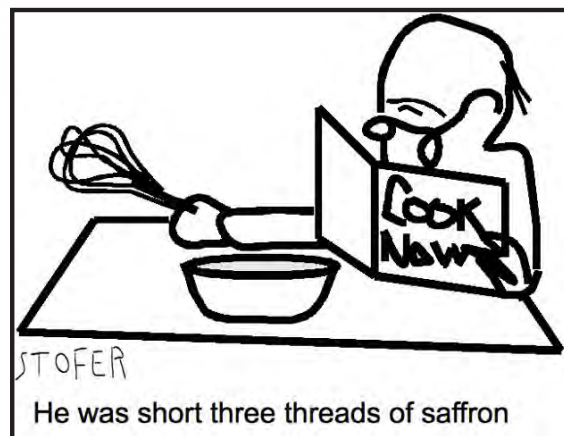
