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TRUMP, TARIFFS & HOW TO START A WAR

The best way to deal with Donald Trump, especially if you are a foreign government negotiating trade issues, is to give him a little win. It doesn't have to be big and important; he's mainly interested in declaring a triumph, and he'll supply the hot air to inflate your little concession into an allegedly major defeat free of charge. Just remember to look crest-fallen, and you're home and dry.

Thus, for example, Trump's recent 'triumph' over Mexico. He threatens escalating tariffs against Mexico, the Mexicans cave in after ten days, and the border problem is solved (until the next time he needs it). Only the nerds notice that the Mexican 'concessions' are almost all actions that Mexico had already promised to take in quiet, orderly discussions with the United States between December and March.

The Canadians did even better when renegotiating the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA). Trump called it the "the worst deal ever signed," but several clauses in the old treaty that Ottawa disliked were dropped. The only Canadian concession was to give U.S. dairy producers access to 10% of the Ca-

nadian milk market (that's just 3 million people) – if they can persuade those Canadians to buy their bovine growth hormone-treated milk.

A very small price to pay, but nobody in Canada was so foolish as to crow out loud that they had seen the Americans off. The Canadian negotiators looked suitably hangdog and defeated, and Trump claimed the credit for a "great deal" and a "historic transaction". Game, set and match to Ottawa.

And so to the grand drama of Trump's tariff war with China. This

THE ZELLA CLARK HEALTH CENTRE

The Denman Health Centre Society is very pleased to announce that it has signed a five year lease of the Medical Clinic with Dr. Stephen Fox, commencing January 1, 2020. Dr. Fox and his team will provide the delivery of family primary health care services to Denman Island.

The current five-year lease, which was entered into with Drs. Tetz, Malthouse and Wilson, expires on December 31, 2019. Dr. Tetz retired in 2017 and Dr. Wilson and Dr. Malthouse have indicated that they plan to retire within the next few years. The new lease with Dr. Fox will ensure that the Denman community will not experience a gap in medical coverage that many other Gulf Islands have encountered upon the retirement of their resident physicians.

Dr. Fox, a well-known and respected physician practicing in the Comox Valley, has already established a strong connection to Denman Island - he is the GP for many Denman residents. He has assembled a team of physicians who will practice in clinics in Cumberland, Bowsyer and on Denman Island. The largest clinic will be a new facility in Cumberland, scheduled to open in early January 2020.

The Denman Clinic will be staffed by both resident physicians and physicians from the main clinic in Cumberland. Dr. Fox has extended an invitation to Drs. Wilson and Malthouse to join the team. Dr. Wilson has accepted and will be continuing his practice at the Denman Clinic on Fridays. The planned schedule for 2020 will have the Denman Clinic open five days a week, Monday to Friday, with a female physician available every week. The team will actively coordinate health care delivery on Denman with other health care providers including emergency services. As a result of the association with the clinic in Cumberland, the Denman Clinic will have a direct connection to the most up to date developments in medical care available on Vancouver Island. During after hours, the Denman Community will have access to an on-call physician by phone and when feasible, an island physician attending. The services of Telehealth, Life Labs and physiotherapy (to begin this fall) will continue in the new year.

The Denman Health Centre Society is a non-profit society that owns and maintains the Zella Clark Health Centre through a volunteer Board. It leases the Medical Clinic and other space in the Centre to tenants who provide health care services for the benefit of the Denman Community. The Society is built on community support and there is no cost for membership: applications available at the Health Centre. The Society is a registered charity and gratefully acknowledges donations and bequests. 🌸

one ought to be a no-brainer, because China is in an extremely vulnerable position. Its exports to America are worth almost three times as much as US exports to China, so it really cannot afford to lose the U.S. market. Chinese President Xi Jinping should just give Trump enough to make him happy – he's easily pleased – and move on to the next problem.

To the extent that Donald Trump calculates his moves beforehand, this would have been his calculation, and it is logically correct. But it didn't work out that way: after a year of escalation and counter-escalation, the two countries are nearing the point where they will have imposed 25% tariffs on all of each other's exports. What went wrong?

Trump issued his usual threats and was the first to escalate at every step of the dance, but if the Mexicans and the Canadians can work around his histrionics, why can't the Chinese?

Maybe it's just pride: Xi simply can't abide the vision of Trump capering with joy as he celebrates his victory over the Chinese. Or maybe it's fear: letting Trump have a victory (and a real one, this time) would so humiliate Xi in the eyes of his own colleagues and rivals that his own position would be in danger.

It's probably the latter. The negotiations seemed to be going well, with Trump predicting an "epic" deal and praising his dear friend Xi. Then suddenly in early May the White House complained that China was trying to re-negotiate points previously agreed, and the whole thing fell apart. It feels like Xi lost an argument at home – which would imply that he is considerably less secure in power than everybody assumed.

In either case, Xi is making a big mistake. The Chinese economy is not doing well. Factory output is declining, and new car sales fell last year for the

first time since 1990. China's total debt, even on untrustworthy official figures, is nearing three times annual GDP, which is the level where panic usually sets in. In fact, it's the level at which Japan's three-decade economic depression began in 1991.

Strip out all the unproductive investment and creative accountancy, and Chinese GDP grew last year by less than 2%. Employment is stagnant, retail sales are falling, the stock market dropped by a quarter last year. This is not an economy in good shape to withstand a prolonged trade war.

The great fear of the Chinese Communist Party is that people will turn against the regime if the economy stalls and living standards stop rising. They certainly don't love the regime. Why else would they obey it? This theory may be tested to destruction in the next few years.

So if Xi is not free to do a trade deal with the US and the Chinese economy tanks, what must he do to save Communist rule and his own power? He will need a foreign war, or at least the threat of one, in order to get nationalism on his side. Not war with the United States, of course. That would be crazy. But Taiwan would do nicely.

And this is one that you really can't blame on Trump.

When you visit Megan Rose's table at the market, you will be greeted with a variety of items that are seemingly unrelated, except by the expertise of their maker. I don't know if Megan is better known by her jewelry, which is handmade from recycled bike parts, or for her Hedgehog sauce, which may be the most delicious thing I've ever tasted... I'm a repeat customer of both, and the Hedgehog sauce is one of my favourite gifts for lovelies near and far in my life. Megan likes to tell folks that the Hedgehog sauce is "like Nutella, except Nutella has a laundry list of ingredients, and the Hedgehog sauce has only 6". Megan also has bedding plants at her table, and will be selling cut basil and dried herbs later in the season. For her plants she only uses organic soil and grows everything without pesticides. You can find Megan against the trees, (and she often has samples, unless they're all gone!).



If you're a late arrival at the market, you probably never see Mary Hicks with her cinnamon buns, because she's usually gone by 11am at the latest, and often much earlier. FROM THE CROW'S NEST: Add Salt to Your Lingo

ama

trimaran outrigger or float (*never* “pontoon”).

anchor rode

line connecting an anchor to the boat.

belowdecks

bulkhead / transverse “wall”; *deck* / “floor”; *galley* / “kitchen”; *head* / “toilet”; *overhead* / “ceiling”; *port* / “window”; *saloon* / dinette seating area

blocks

pulleys

broach

a boat overtaken by a heavily-breaking sea while *running off* can slew sideways and capsize.

capsize

tip over

catamaran

double-hulled, Polynesian sailing craft colonized Oceania.

draft

depth of hull underwater. Shallow-draft, 31-foot *Celerity* draws 30-inches fully laden.

drag / *dragging*

in high winds or anchorages with *poor holding*, boats may drag their anchors downwind until striking another anchored craft or *running aground*.

drogue

hawsers or tire towed astern to slow down and retain control when running off before heavy seas.

fall off

turn away from the wind.

fetch / *to fetch*

distance of open water over which waves can build over time. / Boats *fetch* their objective towards them.

gybe

when *running* downwind, course may be inadvertently or deliberately altered until the wind gets behind the mainsail and, unless controlled, slams it across.

headsails

Celerity carries a *yankee* working jib, or an overlapping *genoa* on her *headstay*.

head up

bring the boat closer into the wind.

leeway

a boat sailing against the wind will be pushed sideways. Aboard a *shoal-draft* trimaran like *Celerity*, the course-made-good while sailing upwind is 10-degrees below the indicated compass heading.

lines

there are no “ropes” onboard a boat, only lines.

luffing

when pinched too close to the wind, the sails will shake, signaling rapid loss of lift and speed.

lying ahull

in heavy weather, a boat with helm lashed and all sail furled will drift broadside to each breaker. (see *capsize*)

mana

Polynesian term denoting a boat’s spirit, her most important attribute.

open roadstead

uncomfortable anchorage fully exposed to the open ocean.

pitchpole

a boat driven too fast down the face of a breaking sea is likely to dig in her bow(s) and violently flip end-over-end.

proa

fast, 60’ single-outrigger sailing canoes employing a high-lift asymmetric hull, developed in Micronesia for scouting distant islands.

seakindly

a boat with an easy motion in a seaway.

sheets

control lines connecting the sails to winches and cleats.

stays & shrouds

wire rigging holding the mast up.

tacking

to reach an objective upwind, a boat sailing *close-hauled* (with sails hauled in close) will *tack* by turning through the *eye* of the wind until the sails fill on the opposite *tack*.

taking a reef

to shorten sail in a blow, the main-

sail is partially furled by tying *reef points* along its folds. When re-hoisted, a double-reefed sail is a fraction of its full size. (Jibs are usually exchanged for a smaller sail.)

traditional sailboats

catamaran (800 BCE), proa (600 BCE), junk (200 CE), trimaran (600 CE), ballasted keel single-hull (1900 CE)

trimaran

sailboat balanced by two outriggers first developed by the Annamese (Vietnamese).

whisker pole

when a jib is carried downwind, this detachable lightweight boom keeps that headsail *wung-out* and bellied full.

wing-and-wing

a boat running downwind in the Trades will often carry a reefed main and jib, or twin jibs *wing-and-wing* on either side. 🍷

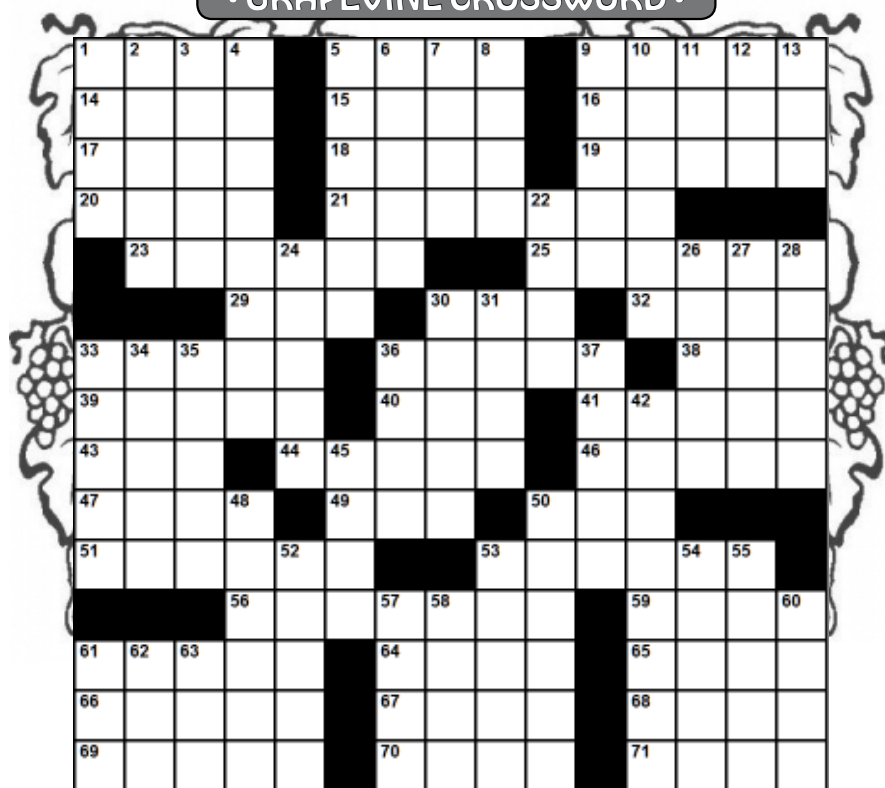
